1. CATHERINE POUJOL

Catherine Poujol is a university Professor at the Institut National des Langues et Civilisations Orientales, (INALCO), Paris (since September 2002). She is the co-director of the Observatory of ex-Soviet States at INALCO since 2010, and ex-director of IFEAC, the French Institute for Central Asian Studies in Bishkek (2016-2020). Dr. Poujol is the holder of the "History and Cultures of Central Asia" chair. She has taught the history and culture of Central Asia from its origins to the present day since 1982. She was the President of ESCAS (European Society of Central Asian Studies) from September 2005 to September 2009 and ESCAS General Secretary from 2001 to 2003. Dr. Poujol is Chevalier de l'Ordre National du Mérite (2017). Her research interests are the history and civilization of modern and contemporary Central Asia, including comparative studies on the colonial, Soviet, post-Soviet periods; the history of Islam from the colonial period to the independent states; the history of Bukharan Jews, and the urban history of Central Asia. She also researches current political affairs and international Relations in Central Asia, as well as social and multiple crisis risks in the region.

2. KAIRAT MOLDASHEV

Kairat Moldashev is an Associate Professor at Suleyman Demirel University in Kazakhstan. He possesses extensive experience in research management and has held senior management positions in higher education institutions both in Kazakhstan and abroad. His research focuses on two primary areas: (1) The political economy of regionalisms and identity politics; (2) Studies in higher education. In the field of the political economy of regionalisms, Kairat has published articles and book chapters on regional integration in prestigious journals such as the Journal of International Relations and Development, Palgrave, and Routledge edited volumes. He is an expert contributor to the Cabar. Asia analytical platform and frequently provides commentaries on political and economic issues to various local and regional media outlets. On higher education, Kairat has published in Studies in Higher Education and other international and local peer-reviewed journals. He is also the author of a widely-used research methods book in Russian, which serves as a coursebook in PhD programs across Kazakhstan. Kairat conducts research methods seminars and workshops for PhD students, early career researchers, and analysts in think tanks. His latest state-funded research projects include post-Covid strategic planning in higher education (2022-24) and the creation of a favorable research environment (2023-25).




